This week we will learn about Moses' return to Egypt to announce that God would soon lead His people out of Egypt to worship Him. We are encouraged to turn to God for help in difficult times, as Moses did. We are reminded that God is with us all the time. This week talk with your child about ways God helps His children, especially in difficult situations. Remind your child that NOTHING is too hard for God. Pray together that God will help your family grow in faith, trusting God to meet all your needs.

God made Me and all things, God loves me and wants me to love Him. Jesus died on the cross and rose from the dead so that I can be part of His family forever.

God Sends Moses

Moses and Aaron took God's message to the people of Israel. When the people saw the signs God gave Moses, they saw the power of God, and believed in Him. When they heard that God loved them and was going to lead them out of Egypt, they bowed down and worshiped God.

Moses told Pharaoh, the ruler of Egypt, to let God's people go so that they could serve Him. Pharaoh said he would not let them go. He made the Israelites work even harder than before. Pharaoh said, "No longer give them straw to make the bricks, let them go gather straw for themselves!" They had to gather the straw, make bricks and build cities for the Egyptians. Their work was very hard.

The Israelites said to Moses and Aaron, "It's your fault that we are being treated so badly!"

Moses didn't know what to do next. So he prayed to God, "Lord, why have you brought this trouble on the people? Is this why you sent me here?"

God answered Moses' prayer. "Moses, you will see what I will do to the king." God promised to free His people from Pharaoh. God said He wanted the Israelites to be His own special people and that He would be their God. He was getting ready to show everyone in Egypt His mighty power.

God wanted His people to trust Him to save them. He wanted His people to turn to Him to help them. God would lead them out of Egypt to the Promised Land just as He promised!
