The Israelite families were kept safe through the perfect Passover lamb's blood on the doorframe of their homes. We will talk about the good news that God kept His promise to send His son, Jesus (God's perfect Lamb) to save His people from their sins. Read John 1:29 with your child. This is where John the Baptist calls Jesus the Lamb of God.

It was time for the Israelites to leave Egypt. God told Moses that He would send a terrible plague on Pharaoh and his people. The Lord passed over the land of Egypt and the oldest son in every Egyptian family died. But God kept His people safe.

Each Israelite family obeyed the Lord by putting lamb's blood on their door frames. They stayed inside and when the Lord passed over their homes He saw the blood on the door frames and saved them from death.

Now Pharaoh was ready to obey God's command after this terrible plague. He called Moses and Aaron. "Go," he cried. "Take your people and animals. Go and worship the LORD as you have asked."

With thankful hearts, God's people hurried out of Egypt. They quickly gathered their belongings and animals. It was quite a parade! God had kept His promise to save and protect them. And God had kept His promise to lead them out of Egypt to serve Him.

This special day was to be called the Passover. The Israelites were to remember and celebrate this day for years and years to come. It would remind them of the Savior whom God promised to send someday.

Later, God would send His Son, Jesus, to be the Savior of His people. Jesus is called the Lamb of God. He died on the cross to save His people from their sins. Everyone who trusts in Jesus is forgiven. It is wonderful that God loves us so much He sent Jesus, the Lamb of God, to be our Savior!
